Newsletter – July

Three Sisters – Round 3 of the 210 Challenge and Round 2 of the Super 60's

This weekend saw visits from a number of potential new drivers for next season that had found the 210 Challenge through the event we attended at Cholmondeley. It was great to see Ron out in Andy Beech's kart giving it his all and enjoying finding the 210's, we hope to see him next season. In a complete contrast to the last meeting, by 12 pm on Sunday we had completed 2 heats (unlike at Fulbeck

where that was when the first heat was) and the final was one of the earliest we have had in my memory! Thank you to Wigan for allowing us to be the first class in the cycle!

Heat 1

The first heat at Three Sisters saw the field lined up at the lights for a clutch melting amount of time before everyone was sent for another trip around the circuit to line up again. Sifleet got a flying start the 2nd time round moving from 6th place to 1st in the first lap, holding this position until the finish line. Whyte fought his way through the field, overtaking Fowler on lap 4 to seal the finishing order and take 2^{nd} with Fowler 3^{rd} . Green had a cracking race, starting at the back of the field and finishing in 6th. 1st Sifleet, 2nd Whyte, 3rd Fowler, 4th Hancock, 5th T. Bury, 6th Green.

Heat 2

Whyte dominated from start to finish with Sifleet and D. Bury battling behind for 2nd place with a number of changes of position throughout the race. Fowler managed a consistent race holding on to 4th from the 2nd lap, keeping Hancock at bay. Masson and Hancock seemed glued together with Masson not managing to overtake. Callaghan started to slow on lap 4 but managed to take the flag to secure some points.

Heat 3

Sifleet took the lead from the lights for the first 4 laps, fighting hard to hold back Whyte. On lap 5 Whyte overtook to take the lead. Callaghan fought hard throughout the heat both with D. Bury and Sifleet to finish 3rd, with Sifleet 2nd and D. Bury 4th. 1st Whyte, 2nd Sifleet, 3rd Callaghan, 4th D. Bury, 5th Hancock, 6th Masson.

Final

There was then a gap mid field giving some fresh air between 7th and Hancock in 6th which Masson couldn't manage to close. The race finished with D. Bury in 1st,

Callaghan in 2nd and Sifleet in 3rd.. 1st D. Bury, 2nd Callaghan, 3rd Sifleet, 4th Whyte, 5th Fowler, 6th Hancock, 7th Masson and 8th Hughes.
