Heat 1

As is the standard with the 2 day meetings, heat 1 was on the Saturday afternoon. Whilst the field was gathering on the dummy grid it was noted that a mysterious number 46 had appeared...T. Bury being entered by Shenington as the number he ran last year rather than his seeded 7 plate!

Whyte had a good start getting in to 1st place by the 2nd lap. D. Bury fought his way in to 2nd by the 3rd lap and over the next few laps they both pulled away from the rest of the field. Behind Whyte and D. Bury was a great battle for 3rd between Callaghan, Woodward, Hancock and T.Bury, with T.Bury coming out in 3rd, followed by Hancock and then Woodward.

Heat 2

Whyte led the field again from lap 2 with Fowler in 2nd. On lap 2 they had a coming together at Café, causing Fowler to bow out. On lap 4 Woodward spun at Café collecting T. Bury and Callaghan who both managed to carry on and finish the race, although Callaghan had to have a quick mechanical stop. Sadly Woodward had to retire. Hancock managed to fight his way through the field to take 3rd with T. Bury taking 4th.

Heat 3

Callaghan dominated this heat, leading from start to finish with D. Bury and Whyte battling for 2nd behind. On lap 5 Whyte managed to overtake D. Bury in to the Chicane to secure 2nd and held that position throughout the rest of the race. Woodward caught D. Bury on the last lap to secure 3rd, with D. Bury taking 4th.
