NEWSLETTER – Rissington Round 1 – August 1st

Heat 1 – L. Sifleet stormed off the line from near the back with A, Sifleet following him through closely followed by Fowler. The top three would hold onto to their positions to the flag. Hopes pursued Perkins and made 4th spot on lap 3 with Perkins making a comeback 2 laps later. A very close finish was seen between Fowler and Perkins with our novices Cox and Shepheard also fighting for places in the mix all 4 they crossed the line with only fresh air between them. **1**st **L. Heat 3 – D. Bury led the pack for 3 laps until L. Sifleet passed him at the end of the Start Straight to take up the lead. A. Sifleet took up 3rd spot whilst Perkins, Fowler, Henry and Stone fought for 4th place. On lap 6 in his excitement in trying to make a move on Henry, Stone took to the grass along the Start Straight, pirouetted beautifully, and with such poise rejoined the track, taking time to wave to his admiring public.

1st L. Sifleet, 2nd D. Bury, 3rd Perkins having demoted A. Sifleet (4th) on the last lap, 5th Fowler 6th Henry.

Heat 2 – saw a quickly drying track. Both Sifleets and Cox were on wets!! L. Sifleet took the early lead followed by D. Bury, A. Sifleet, Henry, T. Bury and Hopes. By lap 4 D. Bury had taken the lead and pulled away from the field, Henry has passed A. Sifleet for 3rd and Fowler was up to 4th closely followed by Hopes. On the last lap Henry mustered every bit of horse power he could and passed L. Sifleet across the line with a gap of only 0.00.14. 1st D. Bury, 2nd Henry, 3rd L. Sifleet, 4th Fowler, 5th Hopes 6th A. Sifleet.
