It would be a close call for all 1-10 seeded numbers. Many drivers would be left thinking 'What if?' 'If only'.....



No. 1 210 Challenge Short Circuit Challenge Champion - Lionel Sifleet.

Sifleet only needed to finish and take it steady but Lionel being Lionel can't help himself and has to be up there at the front. He won heat 1, 4th in heat 2, 3rd in heat 3. He donned fresh new rubber for the final and then uncharacteristically binned it into the tyres just after Pits Bend on lap 4. He certainly had the Villiers gods looking down as after dropping his lowest scoring rounds, this last one being one to drop he clinched the Championship by only 1 point!!!! Well done Lionel and not forgetting his mechanic Mick Sifleet who puts in a lot of hard work.



No. 2 210 Challenge Short Circuit Challenge Runner Up - Dan Bury.

Bury was the dark horse being able to count all his points for the day. A 2nd place in heat 1, achieving a win in heat 2 by leading the field by an astonishing 15.30 seconds and in the rain! Another win in heat 3. In the final he had led the race for the first 5 laps from a charging R. Perkins, having seen the stricken Sifleet parked up he decided to go steady and not press Perkins for the win. Not the best decision in the world as first place would have given him the 2025 title.



No. 3 – Rob Perkins

Heat 1 saw the top three contenders for the Championship at the front of the grid but unfortunately as they lined up for the off R. Perkins was missing. His rear axle had snapped, leaving his rear tyre flying up into the air just before Bruno's Chicane. Luckily everyone missed him. For heats 2 and 3 he was on a mission and finished 2nd in both. In the final he also saw Sifleet sidelined, committed and motivated by lap 6 he'd caught and passed D. Bury to take a well-deserved win. Unfortunately with the highest round of anybody's to drop he now picks up the number 3 spot.



No. 4 – Thomas Stone

Tom our youngest driver has endured a varied season. Before the last round he was lying 5th on the leader board behind Stuart Henry. With some excellent results from the weekend ie 4th in heats 1 and 3 and 3rd position in heat 2 and the final, with no rounds to drop, he finds himself in the seeded position 4, two places up from last year.



No. 5 – Stuart Henry.

Stuart went into the last round knowing that he had to protect his 4th place currently achieved. He is a very consistent driver and would normally accrue some good results. However Sunday wasn't to be heat 1 he finished– 6th, heat 2 - 7th, heat 3 and the final 8th. After dropping his two rounds and not having the best of days results wise that we've come to expect from him he settles for a seeded 5th. Three positions up from last year.



No. 6 – 2025 210 Short Circuit Challenge First Novice – Jack Perkins

He achieved some consistent results at the weekend heat 1, 5th, heat 2, 6th, heat 3 7th and a very creditable 4th place in the final, all adding up to a great seeded 6th.



No. 7 – Russell Hopes

Russell another consistent driver in the challenge, will be hanging on to his seeded 7 saving himself some money for next year as not to buy any new numbers. Going into the last round as previously mentioned he was only 1 point ahead of Jack Perkins. Heat one saw him finish in 11th place with a gear linkage issue which didn't help the points he vitally needed. From then on he gained places each time Heat 2 8th heat 3 6th and a 5th place in the final. Alas not enough points earned to stay ahead of his rival Perkins.



No. 8 – Tony Bury

Tony our septuagenarian plus a few years once again finds himself with a seeded number. Tony has been racing for more years than he cares to remember and is still very competitive. He picked up quite a few points by finishing and scoring in all 4 races at the weekend. Heat 1 – 7th, heat 2 11th, heat 3 10th and 10th in the final.
